ABSTRACT

Origens and Odysseys: Migration in Roman Iberia

The rich body of epigraphic material from Roman Iberia testifies to the population movement of hundreds of individuals, particularly in the first two centuries CE. This paper will present a new open-access digital resource cataloguing and mapping these inscriptions, and consider some of the benefits and limitations of approaching epigraphic data in this way. At the level of individuals, the information provided by these inscriptions is very specific, but taken as a whole it can tell us more about patterns of movement within Iberia. This paper will, for example, explore what we can learn from the epigraphic record about female and family migration specifically, as well as the potential role played by networks in cross-community migration.
